 facilities.
- Monitor Programs the programs in this category should continue to be offered through the Department. They should be monitored to ensure they continue to meet the goals of the Department.

Expand / Enhance

Performing/Visual Arts Classes (beg & int)

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; convenience & youth appeal
- Legacy within Walnut Creek and unique local, regional, national
- Limited providers, regional appeal
- Flexibility of spaces

- Expand program offerings in beg & int, continue to build base
- Result in increase of instructor expense, supplies, materials



Expand / Enhance

Instructional & Recreation/Fitness Aquatics

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; full age spectrum, life skill
- Larkey Pool; case study for value of recreation aquatics
- Opportunities for more broad variety of programs and abilities

- Expand program offerings in both areas; group exercise, learn-to-swim, open swim, fitness/lap swim
- Result in increase of instructor expense, supplies, materials



Expand / Enhance

Health/Fitness Classes (youth & adult)

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; full age spectrum, convenience of location
- Categories are trending upward on a local, regional and national level
- Opportunity to use both indoor and outdoor spaces
- Facilities required are multi-use in nature
- Significant opportunity for partnership

- Expand program offerings in both the youth and adult categories; group exercise, seminars and other programs
- Continue partnership development
- Incorporate more 65+ age programming, losing the "senior" moniker



Recommendation #2: Maintain

- Performing/Visual Art Classes (adv)
- Aquatic Rentals
- Personal Enrichment (youth)
- Personal Enrichment (adult)
- Preschools
- Camps
- Recreation Classes (seniors)



Performing/Visual Arts Programming (adv)

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; full age spectrum
- Legacy programs to Walnut Creek
- Regional appeal
- Potential economic impact as they feed into other programs

- Should continue based on popularity and investment
- Quantity of participation likely to stay static



Aquatic Rentals

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; full age spectrum and aquatics as a line of business was identified as a priority by community
- Swim team rentals are a legacy program
- Opportunity to cross program w/ other municipal providers

FUTURE PROGRAM CONSIDERATIONS

Maintain both competitive and non-competitive programs in this category



Personal Enrichment (youth & adult)

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; broad range, age spectrum, convenience
- Demand is increasing; regional, national
- Local demand is increasing, similar programming through depts

- Maintain program based on trends and community input
- Quantity of participation could increase



Preschools

EVALUATION

- Identified as a priority by community; youth, convenience
- Demand is increasing; local
- Bay Area trending towards facilities w/ licensure capabilities
- Significant private providers
- Department consistent with local trend

- Should continue based on foothold of unique niche market
- Look to cross-promote other programming opportunities in Department
- Opportunity for multi-generational engagement



Camps

EVALUATION

- Hallmark of department, consistent on a local, regional, national level
- Crosses from traditional aspects and into arts programming
- Addresses year around need

- Program could expand, in particular in the 1-day and unique markets
- Become less dependent on rental space to offer



Recreation Classes (senior)

EVALUATION

- Growth on a national level, but moving away from "senior"
- Staying active longer
- Opportunity to cross-promote w/ other municipal providers

- Maintain program, while looking for opportunities to partner and cross-promote
- Begin to roll more active programs into the Health/Fitness category



Recommendation #2: Monitor

- Senior Social Services/Drop-In Services
- Specialized Recreation
- Senior Transportation/Meals
- Indoor Rentals



Senior Social Services/Drop-In Services

EVALUATION

- On a local and national level, most continue to offer
- Appeal is to the 75+ category and market share is shrinking
- Opportunity to cross-promote w/ other municipal providers

- Monitor program
- Offer in more multi-generational environment



Specialized Recreation

EVALUATION

- Unique program
- Challenges w/ finding qualified instructors
- Opportunity for cross promotion and programming

- Monitor program, with possibility of expansion to areas that they are not offered
- Continue to explore partnership opportunities



Senior Transportation/Meals

EVALUATION

- Lyft program has received focus and increased participation in the past year
- Transportation programs less common in comparison to meals
- Meals offered in conjunction with non-profit partner

- Monitor program, continue to follow market share
- Continue to explore opportunities to enhance partnership
- Continue to seek out grant opportunities



Indoor Rentals

EVALUATION

- Significant area of revenue generation for department
- Philosophy of program space first, then rentals
- Demand for indoor rentals is strong as well as static given the availability

- Monitor program, continue current business practices
- Dependent on facilities and programs, could result in increase
- Continue to benchmark fees and charges
